DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Exhibition Planning

- Provide technical advice and expertise to the Head of Production and Artistic Director to assist with the planning and technical viability of proposed artist installations and projects
- Work as part of the Exhibition team to liaise with artists to problem solve and find technical solutions for artists, installation requirements and logistics
- Assist Head of Production in providing quotes on construction, labour, and installation costs for the production of project budgets
- Design and produce drawings for the construction of temporary walls, plinths, and other structures to support and display artworks
- Design and develop solutions for the installation of contemporary art in heritage buildings to ensure the building surfaces and structures are not damaged
- Research and source audio-visual and other specific equipment required for artists' projects (in conjunction with AV Coordinator)
- Plan and devise installation methods and schedules for the installation of artworks at the Biennalemanaged venues as required
- Assist in the preparation of plans and Work Health and Safety WHS documentation the submission of development applications, insurance, and other statutory authority requirements
- Prepare risk assessments in consultation with Registration for all artworks and projects at Biennalemanaged venues as required.
- Recruit, train and manage the team of casual technical and installation staff
- Roster staff in an effective and efficient manner with exhibition team (including Registration Manager), ensure adequate levels of exhibition supervision and security are maintained at all times during the installation and exhibition
- Build a close working team and good cooperative relationships with the Biennale team and external contractors and stakeholders
- Work with Head of Production to allocate appropriate levels of labour to suit artists' projects
- Ensure timesheets are signed off and submitted to the Head of Finance and Administration
